'Burning off Methane Gas in the 'Arctic'...not quite but nearly. Nick Sheehan demonstrates with a very dramatic experiment burning off bubbles of gas.



Changing water into wine and back again!

1 Glass of water, 2 empty glasses, that's what they looked like! Water, sodium hydroxide, phenolphthalein, hydrochloric acid—a few drops. 3 separate stages and it worked. Amazing!



One tiny crystal instantly turns a liquid into a solid!

A supersaturated solution has some very special qualities. Sodium acetate trihydrate. Also illustrates an exothermic reaction of the heat of crystallization.



Balancing the impossible. Balancing a bucket of water with just a slat of wood a few mm long...and the 2 pieces of wood are not joined!



And lots of other experiments, many interactive!

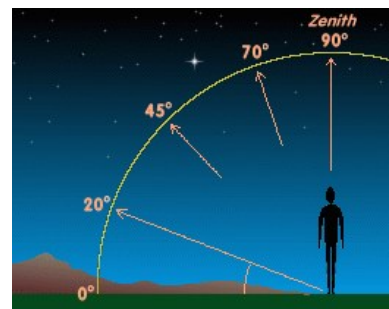


- Where do fish keep their money ?

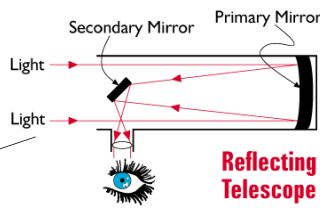
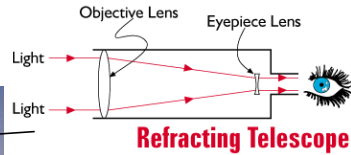
ANSWERS - in this pamphlet.

Angular altitude (or elevation) is measured as 0° at the horizon (when an object is at the point of rising or setting), 45° when 'half way up the sky' and 90° when directly above the observer's head (at the zenith). In the above picture, the bright star has an altitude of about 60° (i.e. it is "60° high").

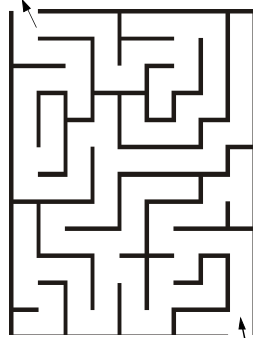
LOOKING UP AND TO 'ZENITH'

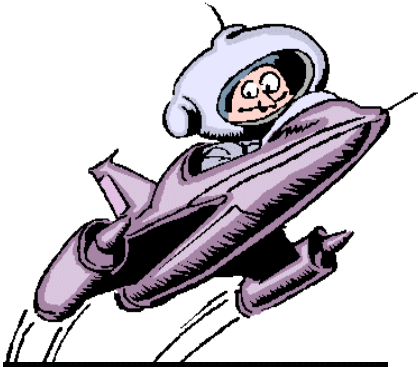

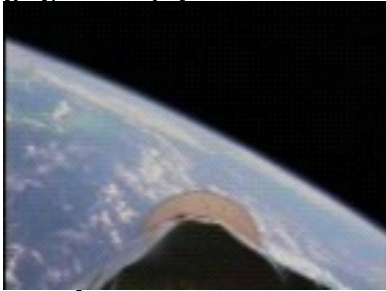

The Cassini Spacecraft was launched in Oct 1997 and reached the orbit of Saturn July 2004. Data from the spacecraft travelling at the speed of light takes 80 minutes to reach earth. The spacecraft is still orbiting Saturn today.
